

THE SCHOOL OF PUBLIC SERVICE AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

In addition to the Doctor of Public Administration program, the School of Public Service and International Studies also offers the Master of Public Administration program, with concentrations in Public Service Management, Health Systems Management and International Public Service. The Master of Science in Health Systems Management is a new program beginning in the fall 1995.

The JD/MPA Public Administration also is offered in conjunction with the Golden Gate University School of Law. The student interested in the combined-degree program must first apply to and be accepted by the School of Law. The student begins the combined portion of the program in the second year of law school.
